Scoreboards generate cash for EVSC high schools

New scoreboards installed last year at Reitz Bowl, Central Stadium and Enlow Field are doing more than telling football fans who's winning the game. They are bringing revenue to Evansville Vanderburgh School Corp. high schools.

The EVSC Foundation on Thursday presented \$5,500 checks to the principals of Bosse, Central, Harrison, North and Reitz high schools. Those funds are be used for the schools' "greatest need" as decided by school leaders, said Amy Romain Barron, treasurer of the foundation. A separate EVSC Foundation fund also is being created to provide matching funds. The match, according to EVSC, will be used to support athletic programs at the five high schools.

The digital scoreboards were made possible by a \$300,000 gift from St. Mary's Medical Center, and they contain revenue-generating sponsorship spaces. "These sponsorships provide the funds available to the high schools today as well as the matching funds in the future," Romain Barron said.
